






Age Group




Male Babies Q4 2023: 57,894










Live births decreased 1.1 per cent

- A total of 112,767 live births was recorded in the fourth quarter 2023, a decrease of 1.1 per cent as compared to the fourth quarter 2022 (114,067 births).
- Fourth quarter of 2000 recorded the highest number of births as compared to the same quarter in the period of 2000 to 2023.






Deaths decreased 4.2 per cent


- A total of 48,250 deaths was recorded for the fourth quarter 2023, a decrease of 4.2 per cent as compared to the fourth quarter 2022 (50,374 deaths).
- Fourth quarter of 2021 recorded the highest number of deaths as compared to the same quarter in the period of 2000 to 2023.

Deaths by quarterly, Malaysia, 2000-2023^p (Q1, Q2, Q3, **Q4**)






Demographic Statistics by State, Fourth Quarter 2023^p, Malaysia





- > Three states with the highest population in the fourth quarter 2023 were Selangor (21.6%) followed by Johor (12.3%) and Sabah (10.9%).
- > Selangor recorded the highest number of live births with 20,931 births (18.6%) while Wilayah Persekutuan Labuan recorded the lowest births with 385 births (0.3%).
- In terms of death, Selangor recorded the highest number with 7,700 deaths (16.0%) while Wilayah Persekutuan Putrajaya recorded the lowest deaths with 69 deaths (0.1%).
- > Selangor recorded the highest number of COVID-19 deaths (23 deaths) while Wilayah Persekutuan Labuan recorded the lowest COVID-19 deaths (1 death).
